## **Summary:**

July is the first month of the Booster Fiscal year, and the start of the fall sports season. There is a mix of activities that go into the month of July as teams are starting to get together but it is not the official start of the sports season. The largest revenue items for the month are Golf Outing Revenue (entry fees and hole sponsors) and Advertising dollars that are starting to come in for the programs and scoreboard.

From an expense standpoint, we cut a check to the football team for their entry into the John Carroll football camp. As in previous years, the football team reimburses are large amount of this entry fee through players selling "discount cards" around Solon, and the revenue from selling the cards is donated back to the Booster Club. We also had expenses to stock the Spirit Store and started paying expenses for the golf outing. For the sports teams, we bought the girls soccer team backpacks. We subsidized a "team building" event for the boys soccer team. We have heard that team building event did not happen so we are waiting for those funds to be returned to us. We bought pom poms for the cheerleaders, and we bought shirts for the girl's golf coaches.

The total assets as of July 31, 2024 is **\$81,482.48**; this represents a decrease in assets of **(\$19,629.52)** from June 2024. For comparison, at this point last year (June 2024), we had **\$101,112.00** in assets.
